

560-546 BC silver stater of Kroisos, legendary king of Lydia, which was the **first** to use pure **silver coins**. Obv: lion and bull facing Rev: punch marks VF surface



Gold (electrum) stater about 16 grams of Kyzicus, a Greek city in Asia Minor. c 440-415 BC Obv: head of Attis wearing Phrygian cap, tuna fish beneath Rev: four part incuse square choice. Possiby struck from a natural gold nugget. 6 to 7 mm thick. VF wonderful style .



Silver didrachm from Akragas, a Greek colony on western Sicily, 510-472 BC Obv. crab Rev: sea eagle EF slight oxidation ...



decadrachm (42.84 grams) signed by the artist Euainetos 405-400 BC Obv: head of Arethusa surrounded by four dolphins, bold signature on die below lowest dolphin. Rev: Four horse chariot in high action, driver crowned by Nike, armour and weapons in exergue. EF, nice large, near round flan. Pleasing die states. Edge split from striking which is near invisible on Arethusa



Silver tetradrachm of Athens 449-413 BC of the Peloponesian War and the time of Socrates. Obv: Athena off center, good crest on helmet Rev: her pet owl nicely framed with ancient test cut EF by wear......\$447.



Silver tetrobols of Histiaia, on the Greek island of Euboia, struck 340-170 BC Obv: Elegant head of the nymph Histiaia, hair rolled up and wreathed. Rev. the nymph Histiaia seated on the stern of a Greek galley, holding a naval standard, reflecting the city's importance as a seaport. Ch. Abt. Unc. \$277. EF or better \$137. VF \$87. F.....\$47.



500-480 BC silver stater of Taras, Greek colony in southern Italy Obv: youth Taras riding dolphin Rev: hippocamp above scallop strong VF, full borders, fine another VF, small thick planchet with only partial borders



280-272 BC silver stater of Taras Obv: naked youth on dolphin Rev: boy crowning his horse EF broad planchet .....another boy on dolphin, VG-F \$157. Fine ...

310-275 BC silver tetradrachm in the name of Alexander the Great, uncertain Greek mint P-857 Obv: **Hercules** in superb high relief style Rev: Zeus enthroned EF+.

C175 BC silver tetradrachm of the Greek city of Maroneia in Thrace. Obv: head of ivy wreathed **Dionysus**, the god of wine Rev: nude Dionysus standing Abt Unc., nice old toning, obv nice style, rev die worn and mushy....... \$397.



179-168 BC silver tetradrachm of **Perseus**, the last king of Macedonia, before Roman conquest. Obv: diademed head of Perseus in fine Hellenistic style Rev: eagle in wreath EF, some reverse oxidation areas....





Silver decadrachm (35.56 grams) of the Greek Ptolemaic dynasty of **Egypt** Struck 246-241 BC at the Alexandria mint by Ptolemy III, step son of Arsinoe II. Obv. diademed and veiled head of deified Arsinoe II (died 270 BC) scepter behind Rev: filleted double cornucopiae EF, slight strike softness at lower obverse. Hard, smooth, nicely toned surfaces. Very underrated with pleasing surfaces



246-221 BC bronze 28 mm of Ptolemy IV of Egypt mounted in wearable modern gold bezel with 7 point diamond Obv: Zeus Rev: Eagle VF coin ......



Silver tetradrachm of Ptolemy XII of Egypt, year 4 or 78/77 BC. Obv. laureate head of Ptolemy I rev: Eagle, this coin was recovered from a **shipwreck** of about 73 BC off the coast of Phoenecia EF+ only the faintest of oxidation issues \$277. Others from the shipwreck with oxidation or encrustation VF...



312-280 BC Silver tetradrachm of Seleucus I, founder of the Seleucid dynasty in the East. Obv: laureate head of Zeus Rev: Athena in huge chariot pulled by 4 horned elephants VF Great type coin. \$1,777.



121-120 BC silver tetradrachm of the Seleucid monarchy, joint reign of Cleopatra
Thea and her son Antiochus 8th. She prepared her son a poisoned drink 



Mithradates II of Parthia silver drachm of his middle period c 110-100 BC Obv: diademed and draped bust of Mithradates II in fine style Rev: archer seated on throne. Abt. Unc. \$147. EF \$87. VF \$57. F.....\$37.




91 BC silver denarius of the Roman Republic struck by the moneyer D. Silanus
Obv: mask of bearded **Silenus** Rev: chariot EF choice full border..... \$297.



68 BC Silver denarius of the Roman Republic struck by moneyer Hosidius Geta Obv: diademed bust of Diana, bow and quiver over shoulder GETA in field Rev: wild boar pierced by spear and being hounded Ex: CHOSIDIC EF ..



Brass dupondius from Nemausus (modern Nimes, France) 29 BC and later Obv: back to back heads of Augustus and Agrippa Rev: crocodile chained to a palm tree. This coin commemorates its settlement by the Greek Egyptian legions of Marc Anthony and Cleopatra who deserted to Augustus and Agrippa EF even dark patina, choice croc, \$677. Fine++ superb eye-appeal... \$377



100 BC to 29 AD pair of Judaean small bronzes, called "Widow's Mites" in the Bible. 238-244 AD bronze pentassarion of the Roman emperor Gordian III struck at his provincial city of Nicopolis as Istrum in the Balkans. Obv. his laureate and draped bust Rev. Aesculapius, the **god of medicine**, standing. Abt. Unc., razor sharp with pleasing patina ...



270-275 AD billon double denarius of the Roman emperor Aurelian Obv: his radiate and armoured bust Rev: Victory presenting wreath to Aurelian Unc. superb silvered surfaces...



270-272 AD billon double denarius of the eastern Roman king of Palmyra Vabalathus, son of a deceased Roman general, (coached by his mother Zenobia) . Obv: laureate bust of the young Vabalathus with the strange title of "Duke of the Romans" Rev: radiate and armoured bust of Aurelian EF or better, no silvering left \$277. VF \$177. Fine \$77. Fair.



244-249 AD silver double denarius of Philip I, possibly the first Christian emperor Obv. radiate and draped bust of Philip Rev: Aequitas, the **goddess of fair** trade, standing, holding scales and cornucopiae. Abt. Unc...



253-268 AD brass of the Roman emperor Gallienus struck in his provincial city of Alexandria Troas in Asia Minor Obv:laureate and draped bust of Gallienus Rev: she wolf suckling twins Romulus and Remus EF very sharp .



260-261 AD Billon (low grade silver) double denarius of **Quietus**, short lived Eastern usurper of the Roman purple. Obv: his radiate and draped bust Rev: Roma enthroned Abt. Unc., much silvering left \$377. EF deposits \$297. VF



260-261 AD Billon double denarius of Macrian, brother of Quietus Obv: his radiate 



Saint Constantius on horseback Rev: elaborate helmet pleasing VF.



1531 silver pfunder of Ferdinand I of the Holy Roman Empire VF, weak at one



1617 silver medal from Saxony commemorating the 100th anniversary of the Reformation Obv: favorable comparison of Martin Luther to Moses Rev: Saxon king and Luther at altar with Bible EF......\$337.



I believe the year with no summer in 1816 was caused by the violent eruption of the Indonesian volcano island of Krakatoa, which spewed so much ash into the atmosphere that summer never came in much of the northern hemisphere, and food shortages followed.
